




Progress on all eight aims:


with a demonstrated impact on over three-quarters of the 35 actions assigned to the EAC.



New grant programs:

the investment of more than \$14 million in grant funding per year into the local arts ecosystem, including increased investment via our Equity & Access program, to a new record of more than \$800,000 in 2023.







Reorganization of the EAC:

development of new positions in Research & Impact, Indigenous Relations and Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access (IDEA), and expansion of the operational team, all while maintaining annual management and administration costs under 10% over the last five years.

Rapid response to COVID-19:

new programs and opportunities for artists and community-based arts programming through EAC events and the Arts Presentation Fund for Covid Recovery.






New technology systems:

SmartSimple to streamline granting, and a new website, allowing for improved access to EAC services, and increased engagement with local arts events and the public art collection.

Survey project:

allowing for data-informed responses to the needs of the arts community and the public over time.






Public Art Policy:

revised to emphasize the principles of public visibility and accessibility, diversity and inclusion, public art appreciation, and city-wide impact.

Shop & Services:

rebranded and expanded services including events and collaborations with the community, and online ticketing integrated into **edmontonarts.ca**.





Cultural Planning Award:

In 2022, the EAC was recognized with the Cultural Planning Award from the Creative City Network of Canada. This award recognizes a Canadian municipality that has developed, adopted, and implemented an excellent culture plan.
