# **Bylaw 17597**

Amendment to the Central MCDougall/Queen Mary Park Area Redevelopment Plan

### **Purpose**

Amendment to the Central McDougall/Queen Mary Park Area Redevelopment Plan to replace Map 12.

### Readings

Bylaw 17597 is ready for three readings after the public hearing has been held. If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, Council must unanimously agree "That Bylaw 17597 be considered for third reading."

### **Advertising and Signing**

This Bylaw has been advertised in the Edmonton Journal on Friday, March 18, 2016, and Saturday, March 26, 2016. The Bylaw can be passed following third reading.

### Report

Bylaw 17597 proposes to amend the Central McDougall/Queen Mary Park Area Redevelopment Plan. The proposed amendment would update Map 12, a zoning map, but does not change any plan policies or objectives.

This Bylaw is accompanied by an associated proposed road closure (Bylaw 17595) and proposed rezoning (Bylaw 17598).

Comments from other civic departments and utility agencies have been addressed.
