
River Valley Planning Modernization

- Ensures that the River Valley remains a vibrant and ecologically resilient network as the city grows





Updates to the River Valley ARP

CONNECTION WITH THE RIBBON OF GREEN

 River Valley ARP points to the Ribbon of Green for detailed planning direction for public open space

UPDATED ARP LAND USE POLICIES

- Restrictions on natural resource extraction and residential development
- Limits on intensive open space facilities, intensive utility infrastructure, and intensive transportation infrastructure

UPDATED DECISION-MAKING FRAMEWORK

- Updated triggers for City Council approval
- Updated assessment requirements for development proposals



Indigenous Participation in River Valley Planning and Management

- Exploring different management models;
 - Co-governance; or co-stewardship; or co-management
 - Indigenous led; or co-created programming
- Essential dialogue and relationship-building w/ Indigenous Nations and Communities
