#### **BYLAW 20621**

To amend Revised Bylaw 19099, City of Edmonton City Operations Project, Source Separated Organics Program

#### Recommendation

That Bylaw 20621 be given the appropriate readings.

### **Purpose**

To amend Revised Bylaw 19099, to decrease the borrowing authority by \$26.78 million from \$51.49 million to \$24.71 million.

# **Readings**

Bylaw 20621 is ready for three readings.

A majority vote of City Council on all three readings is required for passage.

If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, then prior to moving third reading, Council must unanimously agree "That Bylaw 20621 be considered for third reading."

# **Advertising and Signing**

This Bylaw does not require advertising and the Bylaw can be signed and thereby passed following third reading.

Under section 258(5) of the *Municipal Government Act*, a borrowing bylaw does not need to be advertised unless there is an increased cost of more than 15 per cent of the original cost of the capital property.

#### **REPORT**

The history of the borrowing bylaw is as follows:

- At the January 20, 2020, City Council meeting, Revised Bylaw 19099 was passed; and
- At the May 24, 2022, City Council meeting, Bylaw 20107 Revision, amending Revised Bylaw 19099, was passed.

# BYLAW 20621 - To amend Revised Bylaw 19099, City of Edmonton City Operations Project, Source Separated Organics Program

Project 20-81-2041 Source Separated Organics Program was originally budgeted to cost \$51.49 million with \$51.49 million of self-liquidating debt as a financing source. Accordingly, a total of \$51.49 million was originally planned to be borrowed under Revised Bylaw 19099 for this project.

This project is now completed with actual spending of \$31.53 million and actual self-liquidated borrowings of \$24.71 million and \$6.82 million in Retained Earnings.

As a result, this bylaw amendment will decrease the borrowing authority from the \$51.49 million budgeted to \$24.71 million borrowed.

# **Community Insight**

Borrowing bylaws reflect a legislative requirement of the borrowing process. As a result, no community insight is undertaken with respect to the borrowing bylaw process. Where required by the *Municipal Government Act*, borrowing bylaws are advertised.
