#### **BYLAW 20624**

To amend Bylaw 17084, City of Edmonton Waste Management Project, Collection Facilities and Infrastructure

#### Recommendation

That Bylaw 20624 be given the appropriate readings.

### **Purpose**

To amend Bylaw 17084, to increase the borrowing authority by \$25,342 from \$3.33 million to \$3.35 million.

# **Readings**

Bylaw 20624 is ready for three readings.

A majority vote of City Council on all three readings is required for passage.

If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, then prior to moving third reading, Council must unanimously agree "That Bylaw 20624 be considered for third reading."

## **Advertising and Signing**

This Bylaw does not require advertising and the Bylaw can be signed and thereby passed following third reading.

Under section 258(5) of the *Municipal Government Act*, a borrowing bylaw does not need to be advertised unless there is an increased cost of more than 15 per cent of the original cost of the capital property.

#### **REPORT**

The history of the borrowing bylaw is as follows:

• At the March 3, 2015, City Council meeting, Bylaw 17084 was passed.

# BYLAW 20624 - To amend Bylaw 17084, City of Edmonton Waste Management Project, Collection Facilities and Infrastructure

Project CM-33-2028 Collection Facilities and Infrastructure was originally budgeted to cost \$3.33 million with \$3.33 million of self-liquidating debt as a financing source. Accordingly, a total of \$3.33 million was originally planned to be borrowed under Bylaw 17084 for this project.

This project is now completed with actual spending of \$3.35 million, an increase of \$25,342 in the total cost due to inflation.

As a result of this, the bylaw amendment will increase the borrowing authority from \$3.33 million to \$3.35 million. Bylaw 17084 had borrowed \$3.33 million to date and an additional amount of \$25,342 will need to be borrowed to cover the project actual spending of \$3.35 million.

# **Community Insight**

Borrowing bylaws reflect a legislative requirement of the borrowing process. As a result, no community insight is undertaken with respect to the borrowing bylaw process. Where required by the *Municipal Government Act*, borrowing bylaws are advertised.
