Alberta Avenue Business Association Application

August 1, 2024 - Administration received a request to expand boundaries of the BIA


The BIA Regulation AR 93/2016 and City Policy 462B requirements for expansion:

- 1. Formal request including justification; public consultation
- 2. Notification to current and potential members
- 3. Written consent from association's board for draft bylaw
- 4. Community members given opportunity to make representations concerning the change

Administration confirms all requirements have been fulfilled **Council approval is required**



Boundaries (Current and Proposed)





Justification for Expansion - Provided by AABA

- Inclusion of Nodes and Corridors from City Plan (Exhibition Lands, expansion between Downtown and 118 Avenue)
 - Can promote more commercial investment
 - Promotion of Exhibition Lands and business attraction
 - Local access to jobs, community needs
 - Growth of a vibrant, high-density economic hub
 - City's commercial and visitor reputation
 - Businesses pooling resources and collaborating



Effects of Expansion

Exhibition Lands

- Future commercial development of this area expected to be
 14% of the square footage built
- Only 2 current businesses become levy paying members
- All future businesses within the boundary will automatically become BIA members (no option to opt out)

95th Street

- Expansion at the request of a business in the area
- 8 businesses would become levy paying members



Regulatory Requirements

- Reasonable steps to ensure that notification was "mailed or delivered" to affected parties (current and potential members)
- Notice to include:
 - A summary of proposed bylaw
 - A statement that those affected may make representations concerning the proposed bylaw to City Council, and
 - The manner and time period for making those representations
- The Alberta Avenue Business Association has confirmed it mailed out and hand delivered as required



Considerations

BIA Membership Benefits

- Marketing (driving customer traffic)
- Enhanced infrastructure support
- Festival and event planning and operating
- Problem and issue resolution (above 311 support
- Pathfinding for social issues support and resources

- Beautification
- Prioritized service for BIAs (Snow, ice, street cleaning, etc.)
- Advocacy (federal, provincial, municipal, etc.)
- Storefront improvement program



Insight from Administration

- City Ops service dilution possible, however there are no direct budgetary impacts
- Real Estate indicated that impacts to Exhibition Lands sales unknown until developed, but no major impacts anticipated
- All requirements of the application/proposal are met
- Administration has not heard opposition to the proposal
- Open house feedback showed general support for the proposal
- If approved, boundary amendment would take effect as of January 1, 2025

Administration has no reason to suggest the bylaw cannot be read
