Calculations:

97 addresses - 20 addresses (the non representative group) = **77 addresses where responses were given**.

- **71 oppose** out of $77 = (71/77) \times 100 = 92.2\%$
- 7 others support, were undecided, neither oppose nor support out of $77 = (7/77) \times 100 = 9.1\%$
