

Historic Resources: Register and Inventory

The City works with the **Edmonton Historical Board** to review nominations and amendments to the Inventory of Historic Resources in Edmonton. Existing zoning, development rights and regulations still apply to properties on the Inventory.

catalogued and designated by the city and province

The Inventory is a list of heritage resources that merit conservation, but are not legally protected. Once they are designated as a Municipal Historic Resource they are put on the Register and protected.

Statements of Significance

If a building is designated as a Municipal Historic Resource, it is protected from demolition and required to be maintained in a fair condition. Use the search field to filter list by name, year or neighbourhood.
