#### **Edmonton Shelter System**

- Primarily funded by the Government of Alberta
- Regulated through Alberta Health Service and Fire Code requirements and any funding arrangements between the operators and the Government of Alberta, not the Zoning Bylaw
- Concerns about shelter locating in quasi-industrial areas
- Concerns about land use impacts from large-scale shelters

#### August 27, 2024 Urban Planning Committee - CS02526

- Whether larger shelters should be allowed in industrial and quasi-industrial areas in the BE Zone
- Consider additional limitations on shelter location be placed on the Business Commercial (CB) Zone

# Analysis

- Previous engagement:
  - Difficulty in finding suitable locations
  - Limits ability to open where need is greatest
- Analysis:
  - BE Zone throughout industrial areas
  - CB Zone Sites located on the periphery



#### Part 1 of Bylaw 20890 - Recommended

- No proposed restrictions for shelter sites on Business Commercial (CB) sites
- No shelter sites permitted where Business Employment (BE) sites about Heavy Industrial (IH) sites
- Remove 500m2 floor area limit for Year-Round and Seasonal Shelters in the Business Employment (BE) Zone

#### April 1, 2025 Urban Planning Committee - UPE02714

• Consider the maximum floor space of congregate sleeping areas within Seasonal and Year-Round Shelters

# Analysis

- Jurisdiction scan of shelter standard guides
  - Discourages congregate sleeping areas
  - Does not provide guidance on congregate sleeping area design
- Stakeholder Engagement
  - Reduced flexibility
  - Added constraint to finding locations
  - Effect on space availability
  - Responding to emergency situations

#### Part 2 of Bylaw 20890 - Not Recommended

- Limit occupancy to 125 people in Year-round shelters
- Limit may be exceeded for up to 90 days or the duration of the 'emergency'

### **Bylaw 20890**

- If Council chooses to support Part 1 and 2 of Bylaw 20890 Approve in its entirety
- If Council chooses to support Part 1 **OR** 2 of Bylaw 20890 -Motion required by Council
