It is **STRONGLY** recommended that council adopt a motion:

- 1) The definition of Intensive open space facilities be reduced from greater than 10,000m2 for intensive open space to greater than 500 m2, it should be even less in an existing wildlife pinch point. As well, 500 m2 is the number used to define Intensive utilities and transportation infrastructure.
- 2) A definition of "significantly expanded" facilities as referenced in policy 5.2.4 be included within the bylaw
 - From the draft ARP:
 - "5.2.4 City Council approval of a strategic assessment as outlined in Appendix 1 shall be required for new or **significantly expanded** intensive utility facilities, intensive transportation facilities, and intensive open space facilities, if those facilities are proposed on lands identified as designated for River Valley Open Space or Public Utilities, as shown on Map 1."
 - If we don't define "significantly," we should just say "new or expanded."
