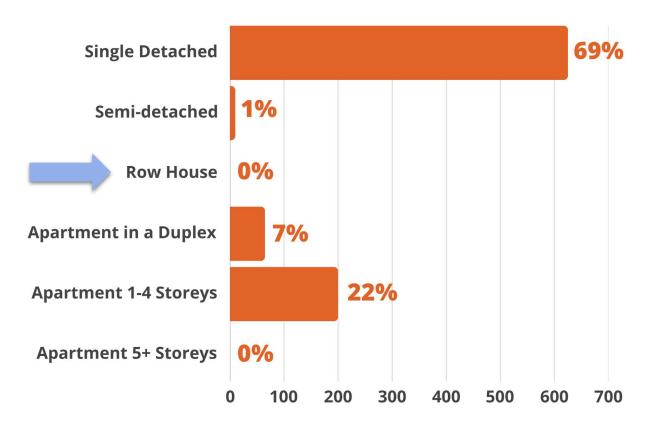

# Urban Mix Policy 2.5.2.5 Alignment

Notwithstanding 2.5.2.4, within the Redeveloping Area, support more intense small-scale residential development with greater massing on **corner sites** in locations outside of a Node or Corridor Area that meet at least <u>one of the following criteria</u>:

- a. Within 100 metres of a Node or Corridor Area
- b. Within 400 metres of a Mass Transit Station
- c. Along an Arterial Roadway or a Collector Roadway

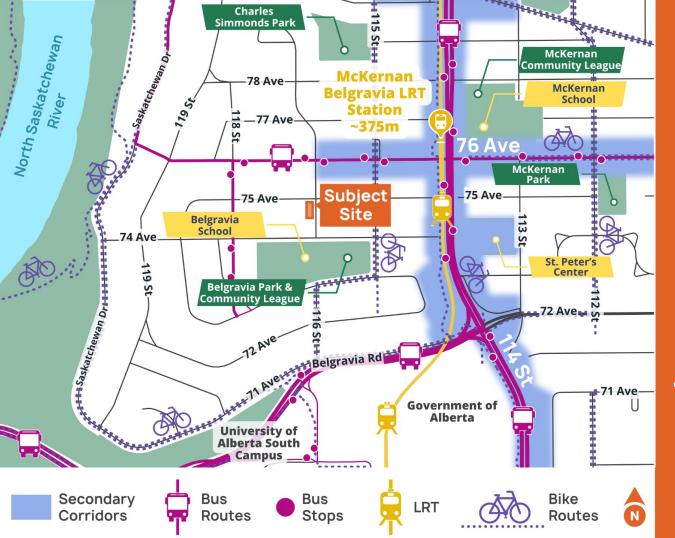
