Subsection (2) permits the Committee to revoke the stay in certain circumstances. Both the <i>Agricultural Pests Act</i> and <i>Weed Control Act</i> impose a mandatory stay on orders under appeal, with no ability to revoke. This amendment ensures alignment with the provincial legislation.</p>
