



MOTIONS PENDING REPORT

10.1 Community Bylaw Court (A. Stevenson)

Councillor A. Stevenson stated that at the next regular meeting of City Council, the following motion would be moved:

That Administration explore the cost, benefits, and feasibility of a Community Bylaw Court in Edmonton, modelled after the City of Calgary's Community Court program, and provide a report at the October 19, 2026, Community and Public Services Committee meeting.

10.2 Priority Growth Areas (M. Janz)

Councillor M. Janz stated that at the next regular meeting of City Council, the following motion would be moved:

That Administration prepare an unfunded service package to establish zoning for the 1.25M Priority Growth Areas that is consistent with the development concept intended in the District Plans, to be considered as part of the 2027-2030 budget deliberations.

10.3 Mass Transit Options for the Northwest District (E. Rutherford)

Councillor E. Rutherford stated that at the next regular meeting of City Council, the following motion would be moved:

That Administration provide a memo outlining mass transit options for Edmonton's Northwest District should the Metro Line LRT not extend beyond Yellowhead Trail prior to the 2M population horizon.

10.4 Motion to Rescind: Northwest Quadrant Transit Service Improvement Options (E. Rutherford)

Councillor E. Rutherford stated that at the next regular meeting of City Council, the following motion would be moved:

That the following motion passed at the December 1, 2025, City Council - Budget meeting, be rescinded:

That Administration provide a report to the Committee with options to improve transit service in the northwest quadrant including but not limited to options for Bus Rapid Transit routings and service-hour increases that could be feasibly considered in the 4-year budget and with any bus service capacity growth.

10.5 Public Library Provisions of Bill 28 (E. Rutherford)

Councillor E. Rutherford stated that at the next regular meeting of City Council, the following motion would be moved:

That the Mayor, on behalf of City Council, write a letter to the Government of Alberta:

1. Expressing concern regarding the public library provisions of Bill 28 and their potential impact on local governance, library operations, access to library materials, patron privacy and the quality of library services in Edmonton.
2. Affirming confidence in the City of Edmonton Public Library Board and its professional staff to manage library collections and services in accordance with existing legislation, board policies and community standards.
3. Calling on the Government of Alberta to engage in direct consultation with the Coalition of Alberta Public Libraries, municipalities, and library boards before finalizing any regulations or guidelines under the public library provisions of Bill 28.
4. Requesting that any related operational requirements imposed on public libraries are accompanied by dedicated provincial funding.

10.6 Multi-Use Trail Opportunity - Fort Edmonton Bridge to Whitemud Road (M. Elliott)

Councillor M. Elliott stated that at the next regular meeting of City Council, the following motion would be moved:

That Administration prepare an unfunded capital profile for consideration as part of the 2027-2030 City Council Budget Deliberations to complete technical studies, concept design and engagement (including Indigenous engagement) for a multi-use trail from Fort Edmonton Bridge to Whitemud Road.
