

Transportation Committee Report

Proposed Amendments to City Policy C514 – Implementation of Speed Limits Around Schools

Recommendation of the Committee

- 1. That the July 9, 2014, Transportation Services report CR_1255, be received for information.
- 2. That \$500,000 be allocated to fund the 2014 implementation of 30km/h school zones at school locations with elementary school grades, except those on arterial roadways, and that the source of funds be the projected excess over budgeted automated enforcement fine revenues.
- 3. That Administration prepare amendments to Bylaw 6894, Speed Zone Bylaw, to return to Transportation Committee, on or before October 30, 2014, to decrease maximum speeds within certain school zones to 30km/h, as described in the July 9, 2014, Transportation Services report CR 1255.

History

At the July 9, 2014, Transportation Committee meeting, the July 9, 2014, Transportation Services report CR_1255 was considered and the following motion was passed:

That Administration provide a report on traffic safety and statistics affected by the 2014 change in elementary school zones to 30km/h speed zone following the 2015-2016 school year.
