



## **Transportation Committee Report**

2014 - 2018 Bike Lane Infrastructure Plan

## Recommendation of the Committee

That the enhanced public engagement strategies, outlined in the June 5, 2014, Transportation Services report CR\_1032, be approved.

## **History**

At the June 5, 2014, Transportation Committee meeting, the June 5, 2014, Transportation Services report CR 1032 was considered and the Committee heard from C. Chan, Edmonton Bicycle Commuters Society; C. Nobert, Strathcona Community League; E. Solez, Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues; M. Phair, Bike Route Working Group; L. Falk; and D. Bews, Complete Streets Strathcona. The following motions were passed:

- That the report on the results of consultation and evaluation on the 121 Avenue and 76 Avenue bicycle network, be deferred until completion of the consultation on major bike routes, neighbourhood bike routes being considered in conjunction with neighbourhood renewal/revitalization and shared-use paths, outlined in Attachment 1 of the June 5, 2014. Transportation Services report CR 1032.
- That Administration provide a report on a plan to fully engage communities regarding bike lane infrastructure and/or complete streets programs as part of the neighbourhood renewal process.
- That Administration provide a report on the 106<sup>th</sup> Street Bike Route Winter/Spring Pilot Project.
- That Administration consider north/south connections to the 83<sup>rd</sup> avenue route and provide a report with recommendations on any revisions to the Bicycle Transportation Plan or the major bike grid.
