Charter Bylaw 19205

To allow for row housing, Inglewood

Purpose

Rezoning from US to RF5; located at 11315 – 128 Street NW.

Readings

Charter Bylaw 19205 is ready for three readings after the public hearing has been held. If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, Council must unanimously agree "That Charter Bylaw 19205 be considered for third reading."

Advertising and Signing

This Charter Bylaw has been advertised in the Edmonton Journal on May 22, 2020, May 30, 2020, and June 2, 2020. The Charter Bylaw can be passed following third reading.

Position of Administration

Administration supports this proposed Charter Bylaw.

Report

This Charter Bylaw proposes to change the zoning for this site from the (US) Urban Services Zone to the (RF5) Row Housing Zone, which would allow for the development of up to 20 Dwellings of Multi-unit Housing. The RF5 Zone allows for multi-unit housing with a slightly greater density and height than the (RF3) Small Scale Infill Development Zone which applies to most of the surrounding land.

This site is suitable for the additional development permissions allowed under the RF5 Zone as it is located on a corner, adjacent to a school site and separated from lower scale residential zoning by roadways. Moreover, the site is within walking distance to a variety of amenities including commercial services, frequent transit service, a bike lane and school/park sites.

All comments from civic departments or utility agencies regarding this proposal have been addressed.
