#### Program Objectives - Scope of Work

- Neighbourhood Renewal Program (NRP) includes Residential and Industrials local and collector roadways.
- Scope of work includes:
  - Roads
  - Curbs and gutters
  - Sidewalks
  - Street lighting
  - Missing links in ROW sidewalk/MUT and bike systems
  - Pedestrian Safety
  - Alley in scope but funding model not finalized



#### Types of Neighbourhood Renewal

- Microsurfacing (Operating Program)
  - Roads are resealed with a thin asphalt ride surface.
  - Microsurfacing candidates have good road conditions and are applied 10-12 years after road reconstruction or resurfacing
- Neighbourhood Overlay (Capital Program)
  - Roads are repaved and sidewalk panels treated to eliminate trip hazards.
  - Overlay neighbourhood candidates have poor road condition and good sidewalk condition
- Neighbourhood Reconstruction (Capital Program)
  - Roads are repaved, sidewalk, curb and gutter, and street lights are replaced.
    - Reconstruction neighbourhood candidates have poor sidewalk and fair to poor road conditions



#### Coordination of Projects

- Transportation Services collaborates with other City Depts. in order to maximize investments and minimize disruption
  - Infrastructure Services (Drainage)
  - Community Services (Office of Great Neighbourhoods)
  - Sustainable Development




## Program Objectives Scope of Problem

- There are 300 neighbourhoods (including industrial) in Edmonton.
- The age of NBHD (assuming 40 50 year service life) and its renewal history, influences the type of renewal required
- As of 2010 Year End, over 169 neighbourhoods require renewal, where:
  - 111 require reconstruction
  - 58 require overlay

## Program Objectives Life Cycle Needs

- Life cycle approach to neighbourhood roadway renewal
- New Construction Standards and proper treatment during life cycle provide 60 Year Life Span
  - Microsurfacing (preventative maintenance) yr 10
  - Roadway overlay yr 30
  - Microsurfacing (preventative maintenance) yr 40
  - Reconstruction yr 60
  - Major drainage and cast iron renewal at time of reconstruction

### Program Objectives Renewal Targets

#### Targets:

- Financial stream fully funded by Neighbourhood Tax levy/ Local Improvement - MSI phased out in 2018
- Condition rating target for roads 3.0 out of 5.0
- 0% sidewalks in "F" condition
- Drainage and cast iron programs fully integrated and keeping pace
- Alley Renewal (using 50/50 cost sharing also in place)
- Ensure coordination with Great Neighbourhoods and Redevelopment plans

# Program Objectives Challenges/Risk Management

- Risk Management/Challenges:
  - Managing Industry capacity/construction Inflation-Long term NBHD Recon contracts (3 -6 years)
    - Bonus/Penalty
    - Neighbourhood Pricing Index
  - Increase in-house (Roadway Maintenance) paving capacity for collector and NBHD (Tied to enhanced snow removal program equipment purchases)
    - Utility rate increases required in conjunction with the Neighbourhood Tax levy

# Program Objectives Targets and Challenges

- Emerging Issues:
  - 2012 2014 Capital Budget MSI funding component reduced due to reallocation to other rehabilitation programs
  - Alley Renewal Strategy using 50/50 LI Alley reconstruction
  - Renewal for Rural unpaved Local/Collector residential and industrial roadways now included in program


### Program Objectives Renewal Funding Needs

- Based on approx. 300 residential/industrial neighbourhoods, to achieve life cycle model, the annual required program:
  - 5 microsurfacing neighbourhoods (\$0.5M each operating)
  - 6 overlay neighbourhoods (\$2.5M each capital)
  - 5 6 reconstruct neighbourhoods (\$17.5M each capital)
    - 2 years to complete, working in 10 12 neighbourhoods/year)
  - Collector Renewal (\$20M capital)
  - Alley renewal (\$8M capital required annually)
  - Average annual ongoing funding would be approximately \$140 million, plus drainage and water


## Funding Sources: Neighbourhood Renewal Tax Levy

- Council approved: 2% in 2009/2010, and 1.5% in 2011.
- Program reviewed regularly with the intent to continue allocating tax increases for a sustainable renewal program
- With current (moderate) inflation forecast,
   Transportation Neighbourhood Renewal Program
   Tax Levy requirements are projected to be:
  - 1.5% increase in property tax every year for the first15 years
    - Average condition of all neighbourhood roads will reach 3 (out of 5) in 20 25 years

### Neighbourhood Funding Planned Renewal Tax Levy




## Neighbourhood Funding 2012-2014 Budget Renewal Tax Levy

- 2013 NBHD Program
  - 9 Recon (complete 3/continue 1/start 5)
  - 6 Overlay
  - 2 Microsurfacing
- 2014 NBHD Program
  - 10 Recon (complete 6/start 4)
  - 5 Overlay
  - 2 Microsurfacing





## Recommend Budget Changes to Reinstate Renewal Targets

- Overlay Program
  - \$10M carry forward from 2011 Savings
  - First priority add Evansdale (Ward 3) and Keheewin (Ward 10)
- Reconstruction Program
  - \$30M addition by reinstating MSI funding
  - Dovercourt, Terrace Heights, Grovenor,
     Hazeldean and Laurier restored to original schedule
