- EPC carefully reviewed the police budget
- \$3.4M reallocated to reduce the overall request
- Solid and reasonable budget request

- Increased severity of violence
 - •Homicide, aggravated assault, sexual assault
- New Remand Centre in 2013
- Expanded federal prisons in Edmonton
- Mental health, poverty, substance abuse, homelessness



Requested Positions

Traffic Enforcement Units: 42 positions
Entertainment Zone Beat Officers: 15 positions
Surveillance Unit: 7 positions
Neighbourhood Empowerment Teams: 2 positions
Public Safety Compliance Teams: 2 positions

Total of 68 positions: 65 sworn, 3 non-sworn
