Bylaw 15466 Amendments to the Community Standards and Licence Appeal Committee Bylaw 15166

Purpose

To amend the Community Standards and Licence Appeal Committee Bylaw 15166 to change the appointment of Councillors from one year to a three-year term.

Readings

Bylaw 15466 is ready for three readings.

This Bylaw is authorized under the *Municipal Government Act*. A majority vote of City Council on all three readings is required for passage.

If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, then prior to moving third reading, Council must unanimously agree "That Bylaw 15466 be considered for third reading."

Previous Council/Committee Action

At the October 28, 2010, City Council meeting, the following motion was passed:

That Administration prepare amendments to the Community Standards and Licence Appeal Committee Bylaw 15166 to change the appointment of Councillors for the three-year Council term.

Report

 In early 2009, Council discussed options to restructure the Community Standards and Licence Appeal Committee. At that time, Council determined that the current structure of a committee comprised of only Councillors was to continue.

Highlights of Bylaw 15466

Consecutive Terms

- Bylaw 15466 allows Council to appoint Councillors to the Community Standards and Licence Appeal Committee for consecutive three-year terms, to a maximum of six years.
- No limit on time: If Council wishes to place no limits on the amount of time a Councillor may serve on this Committee, Council will need to make the following motion:

That section 5 of Bylaw 15466 be amended by deleting section 6.1(3) the remainder of the sections renumbered.

 No limit on time, but limit successive terms: If Council wants Councillors to be able to sit on the Committee for more than one term, but not successive terms, Council will need to make the following motion:

That section 5 of Bylaw 15466 be amended by deleting section 6.1(3) and replacing it with:

6.1(3) Councillors may not be appointed to the Committee for successive terms.

Chair and Vice Chair

- A Chair and Vice Chair will be elected each year.
- If Council wishes for the Chair and Vice Chair to sit for the entire threeyear term, Council will need to make the following motions:

That section 5 of Bylaw 15466 be amended by deleting section 6.1(5) and replacing it with:

6.1(5) At the Committee's first meeting following the meeting at which Council makes appointments to the Committee, the Committee must elect from among its members, a Chair and a Vice Chair.

Policy

The recommendations in this report comply with the *Municipal Government Act* and Procedures and Committees Bylaw 12300.

Corporate Outcomes

The content of this report is consistent with City Council's Strategic Vision, Conditions of Success, in terms of ensuring organizational capacity, efficiency and consistency.

Justification of Recommendation

Appointing Councillors to a three-year term will provide enhanced efficiency and consistency in membership to this Committee.
