Bylaw 19121

Amendment to the Animal Licensing and Control Bylaw 13145

Purpose

A Bylaw to amend the *Animal Licensing and Control Bylaw* 13145.

Readings

If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, then prior to moving third reading, Council must unanimously agree "That Bylaw 19121 be considered for third reading."

Position of Administration

Administration supports this Bylaw.

Previous Council/Committee Action

At the December 4, 2019, Community and Public Services Committee meeting, Bylaw 19121 was forwarded to City Council for the appropriate readings.

Report Summary

Bylaw 19121 will amend the fee schedule contained in the *Animal Licensing and Control Bylaw* 13145 to increase the annual licence fees for cats and dogs by \$1, effective January 1, 2020. The additional revenue will be used to offset expenses of *Animal Protection Act* enforcement responsibilities.

Report

On February 1, 2019, the Edmonton Humane Society discontinued enforcement of the *Animal Protection Act* and the City of Edmonton began enforcement of the Act. On August 28, 2019, City Council approved an increase to pet licensing fees by \$1 as part of a funding proposal to offset expenses of *Animal Protection Act* enforcement. In addition, City Council directed Administration to fund the remaining program funding requirements of \$150,000.

Administration anticipates the fee increase will generate approximately \$100,000 in additional revenue annually. The increase does not apply to the Nuisance or

Restricted Dog Licence fees. The last increase to the dog and cat licence fee was on January 1, 2016. The licence fee increase will come into effect on January 1, 2020.
