

SECOND WAVE ESCALATION MODEL

LEVEL ONE *LIMITED RISK*

Increase:

- + Education/Awareness
- + Health & Safety Measures
- + Face Covering Compliance

LEVEL TWOCAUTION

Short/Long Term:

- + City Owned Facilities
- + Programs/Services
- + COE Staff Return to Work Strategies

LEVEL THREE *RESTRICTION*

Legislative Restrictions:

- + Public Space (indoor/outdoor)
- + Public Transportation
- + Retail/Commercial Property

LEVEL FOUR *EMERGENCY*

SOLE:

- + Control of Movement
- + Control Over Goods, Services or Property
- + Enact Emergency Powers to Respond

LEVEL FIVECRITICAL

Mandatory:

+ Regional/Provincial CMOH/GOA Order

Update - Mandatory Face Coverings Bylaw

Bylaw Compliance (Week of Aug 17-23)

- Community and Recreation Facilities 98.1%
- Transit 95%
- Public Spaces 97%
- Vehicles For Hire 86%

Overall Compliance 96%

Exemption Card Program Reassessment

- Considering options to add more rigor, assurance
- Engagement with BIAs, Accessibility Advisory Committee
- AHS and Pandemic Response will weigh in on options



Update - Camp Pekiwewin

- Frequent engagement with Camp organizers, the community and social support agencies
- New demands released Friday
- Weekly meetings to establish the conditions for shutting down
- Goal is to ensure a transition to permanent housing solutions



City Hall Relaunch Phases

	Description	Timing/Targets	
1	The Hallway Cafe opens (separate from the main building)	August 17	
2	Guidelines developed for Councillors' offices to hold meetings with the public, by appointment only	September 7	
3	Pre-registered speakers/attendees may attend City Council and Committee meetings in-person	September 14	
4	Return to work of civic employees at City Hall	TBD - to align with corporate guidelines	
5	City Hall and Parkade open to public for general access and other services	TBD - based on success of phases 1-4
