



Edmonton Zone New Cases by Month






Confirmed Cases by Zone (Cumulative)

Update - Mandatory Face Coverings Bylaw

Bylaw Compliance (Week of Sept. 8- 15)

- Community and Recreation Facilities 97%
- Transit 96%
- Public Spaces 99%
- Vehicles For Hire 93%

Overall Compliance 97%

Exemption Card Program Reassessment

- Options considered during engagement with BIAs, Accessibility Advisory Committee, AHS and AH
- Three pronged communications approach

Update - Camp Pekiwwewin

- Engagement with Camp organizers, the community and social support agencies
- Identifying conditions for wind down to ensure the safety of those in the camp and in the community
- Goal is to ensure a transition to permanent housing solutions but bridging measures are necessary now



Future EAC Meetings

- The pandemic will continue for the foreseeable future; wave 2 escalations are possible
- Administration's priority is a safe and effective relaunch and recovery
- Information and decisions are less acute
- Recommend to replace EAC meetings with monthly updates at City Council and reduce Council update memos to once a week
