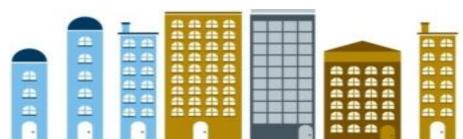

2019 PBR Progress Report

- The 2019 PBR Progress Report provides an annual update to the City of Edmonton on the operational and financial results for In-City Water Services, Wastewater Treatment Services, and Drainage Services in accordance with the PBR plans approved in EPCOR Water Services and Wastewater Treatment Bylaw No. 17698, and EPCOR Drainage Services Bylaw No. 18100

 - Bill comparisons with other municipalities; and
 - Final update for the 2019 Operational Plans.

Lower than forecast capital expenditures in 2019 result primarily from scope and timing adjustments to the mid-point operations centre, deferral of digester 4 upgrades, and scope reductions to rehab and life cycle replacement projects, partially offset by higher expenditures on sludge lines and pipe racks.

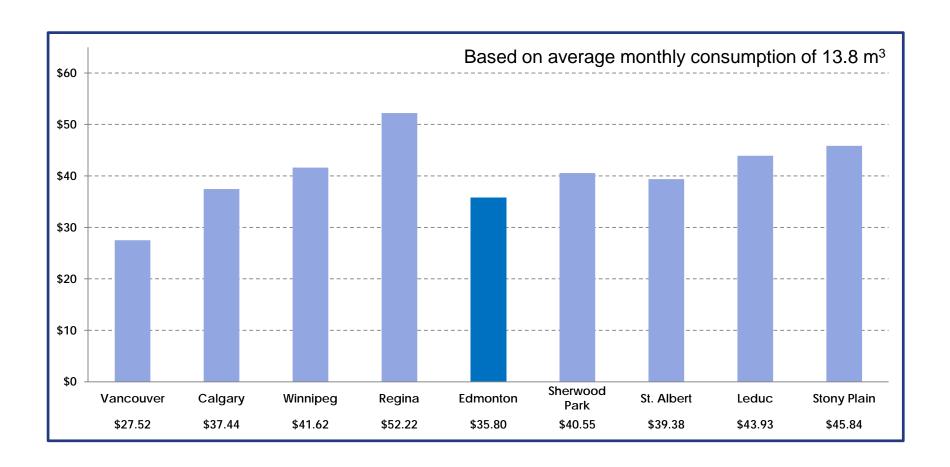

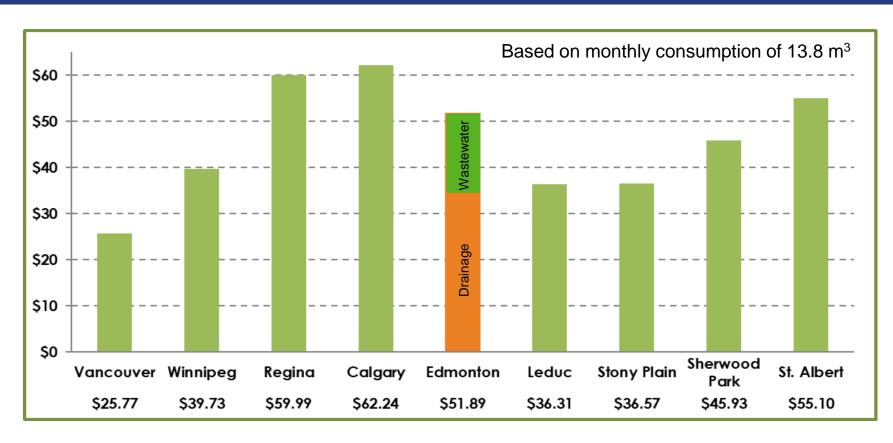
Residential Water Bill - 2019
