Calgary, Alberta	The city runs a green cart program for all food and yard waste where additional food and yard waste can be set out for collection in compostable bags or bundles. St. Albert, Alberta	Households and some multi-family homes and condo complexes are provided with a green organics cart with curbside collection. The city also provides online educational resources on how to compost at home and refers to the City of Edmonton's home composting programs for more information.

Strathcona County, Alberta	Offers a green cart program to collect organic materials for its residents. Limited home composting educational information is provided on their website. Also, runs a Community Garden program to help residents and local non-profits establish community-led garden projects in County parks and green spaces; yet, there is no direct mention of composting at the community garden sites.

Winnipeg, Manitoba	A social enterprise of Green Action Centre called Compost Winnipeg provides a composting service that caters to residents, offices, multi-residential buildings, on-site composters, small restaurants and cafes for a fee. One initiative is a home compost pickup (\$25 per month plus \$12.50 starter kit) which includes a weekly collection of organic waste to be composted. In addition, Green Action Centre runs compost presentations and a Master Composter volunteer program focused mainly on composting. Currently, it does not have an organics collection program, but an organics waste pilot program is included in their five-year waste management strategy for 2020.

Brandon, Ontario	Runs a voluntary green cart program to divert organic waste from landfill and six compost depots where residents can drop off excess yard, garden and food waste. They provide limited information on backyard composting. <u>http://brandon.ca/sanitation/collection/green-cart-program/compost-depots</u>
Saskatoon, Saskatchewan	Has an optional fee-for-service program green cart program for residential yard and food waste. Home composting initiatives are coordinated by the Saskatchewan Waste Reduction Council (SWRC) on behalf of the city including education on backyard composting, indoor composting, a \$20 rebate program for compost bins and two Compost Depots where residents can drop off yard waste at no cost.
