Update: Escalation of COVID-19 Cases


 Increased case numbers in Edmonton Zone:

1,063 active cases

94.6/100K active case rate

13 sub zones on Watch

- What is driving the increase?
- Approaches to manage situation





Update: Recommended Approaches

- Collaborative communications targeting social groups, cohorts, communities, businesses and geographical areas experiencing outbreaks
- Administration supports mandatory reductions in cohort numbers, indoor/outdoor and seasonal gathering sizes and frequency
- Work from home strategy for Edmonton businesses
- Restricting non-essential travel



Context For Recommended Approaches: 2nd Wave Progression Model

LEVEL TWO

LEVEL THREE RESTRICTION

LEVEL FOUR EMERGENCY

CRITICAL

Increase:

- + Education/Awareness
- + Health and safety measures
- + Face Covering Compliance

Short /long Term:

- + City owned Facilities
- + Programs/Services
- + COE Staff return to work strategies

Legislative restrictions:

- + Public Space (indoor/outdoor)
- + Public transportation
- + Retail/commercial property

SOLE:

- + Control of movement
- + Control over goods, services or property
- + Enact emergency powers to respond

Mandatory:

 Regional/Provincial CMOH/GOA Order

INDICATORS THAT SUPPORT PROGRESSION

- → 50 cases/100K
- Edmonton case epidemiology (Distribution, frequency, pattern, determinants, control)
- Will COE intervention/response strategies reduce case numbers



Update: What We Are Watching

- Community Standards Enforcement Officers monitoring business compliance in hotspots/Watch zones
- Collaboration with AHS inspectors targeting Watch zones
- Ongoing monitoring of mandatory face covering practices in transit, recreation centres and facilities, businesses
- Workplace Reintegration strategies and Remote Work Program
