New Provincial Legislation of Interest Summary Table

The following table provides a high-level scan of some of the legislation that was approved during the 2nd Session of the 30th Alberta Legislature (February - July 2020) that may be of heightened municipal interest.

Bill 2 - Gaming, Liquor and Cannabis Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on June 17, 2020	 Relaxes a number of regulations related to the consumption of alcohol in public spaces Provides municipalities with the discretion to allow alcohol consumption in public parkland without the requirement for food
Bill 3 - Mobile Home Sites Tenancies Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on May 12, 2020	Allows tenants and landlords of mobile home sites access to the Residential Tenancy Dispute Resolution Service
Bill 4 - Fiscal Planning and Transparency (Fixed Budget Period) Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on June 26, 2020	 Requires that a provincial budget must be released each year in the month of February Provides municipalities with greater certainty as to when the Provincial budget will be finalized that may include any changes to municipal funding streams
Bill 8 - Protecting Survivors of Human Trafficking Act Came into force on May 12, 2020, except Part 2, which comes into force on July 1, 2020	 Introduces new measures to help address human trafficking, sexual exploitation and forced labour Legislation allows peace officers to arrest a person if they commit an offence under the Act, but municipal peace officers do not currently possess this power as it is not listed on their appointment documents.
Bill 9 - Emergency Management Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on March 20, 2020	Enables local and provincial states of emergencies to exist concurrently during emergencies
Bill 10 - Public Health (Emergency Powers) Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on April 2, 2020	Implemented increased fines for violation of public health orders
Bill 11 - Tenancies Statutes (Emergency Provisions) Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on various dates	Prevents landlords from increasing rent or charging late fees so long as the state of public health emergency was in effect

Bill 13 - Emergency Management Amendment Act, 2020 (No. 2) Came into force on May 12, 2020	 Allows municipal states of local emergency to last for 90 days and creates new offences for failing to comply with a state of local emergency order
Bill 19 - Tobacco and Smoking Reduction Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on June 26, 2020	 Extends rules around the advertising, promotion, sale, and use of vaping products
Bill 21 - Provincial Administrative Penalties Act Came into force on July 23, 2020, with exceptions	 Creates an administrative penalty process for regulatory offences, such as traffic violations Later phases of implementation may affect prosecutions of bylaw offences
Bill 22 - Red Tape Reduction Implementation Act, 2020 Came into force on various dates	 Omnibus bill amending different legislation to cut regulations by one-third and reduce red tape Includes a new process for establishing a Regional Services Commission
Bill 23 - Commercial Tenancies Protection Act Came into force on July 23, 2020, with certain sections taking effect March 17, 2020	Similar to Bill 11, it prevents landlords from terminating leases for reasons of non-payment during COVID-19 and prevents late fees and rent increases between March 17 and August 31, 2020
Bill 24 - COVID-19 Pandemic Response Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on June 26, 2020, with some sections taking effect earlier	Omnibus bill allowing the government to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic without staying in a state of public health emergency
Bill 26 - Constitutional Referendum Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on July 23, 2020	 Amends legislation to allow referendums to be held on more than constitutional issues These referendums can be held in conjunction with a provincial or municipal election or separately
Bill 29 - Local Authorities Election Amendment Act, 2020 Came into force on September 1, 2020	 Changes the Local Authorities Election Act and how future municipal elections are conducted Amendments include increasing contribution limits for election donations, reducing the amount of money that can be carried forward from campaign surpluses, and changing contribution rules for third-party advertisers as well as what activities are regulated
Bill 32 - Restoring Balance in Alberta's Workplaces Act, 2020 Came into force on various dates	 Omnibus bill that introduces a number of changes to the Employment Standards Code, the Labour Relations Code and other labour-related legislation Includes changes that touch upon unionized and non-unionized environments in the public sector

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
