### **Public Engagement Findings for Short-Term Rentals**


#### **Key Findings**

The following are the key findings from in-depth interviews with stakeholders, focus groups with short-term rental hosts and guests, and online surveys with Canadian travellers and Edmonton residents.

- Familiarity with short-term rentals is mixed among Edmontonians.
- Edmontonians see the potential benefits of short-term rentals, but also have concerns (mostly related to nuisance issues, neighbourhood disruptions, safety).
- Balancing the needs of various stakeholders and ensuring the regulations are fair is important.
- Hosts and guests tend to favour a more lenient approach to regulation, while those directly involved in or affiliated with the traditional accommodation industry tend to favour a more restrictive approach. Edmontonians expressed a wide range of thoughts about what approach the City should take when regulating and had mixed opinions between the complete ban and no regulation at all.
- At minimum, stakeholders feel that regulations (if they are implemented at all) for short-term rentals should include a safety component, in order to protect the safety of hosts, guests and neighbours.
- Some stakeholders mentioned that the regulations put in place have the
  potential to positively influence Edmonton's reputation (if viewed as a city
  that protects guests) or negatively influence Edmonton's reputation (if
  someone is injured at an unregulated short-term rental).
- Some stakeholders cautioned against overregulation, feeling that if the short-term rental regulations are too strict, it will not be possible to enforce them, it may drive short-term rentals underground (resulting in an illegal market place), or may push certain hosts (e.g. those with only one property who are aiming to share the home they live in) out of the industry.
- There is debate about whether or not short-term rental hosts should require a business licence at all times, in some circumstances, or not at all. Some favour different regulatory structures based on things such as the property type the host is renting, how many properties are being rented, where they are located and income generated.


