Business Licence Bylaw Renewal

Objectives

- Remove unnecessary barriers for businesses and enhance service efficiency,
- Support faster licensing decisions when new types of businesses emerge, and
- Improve alignment with regulatory partners and ensure a more timely and effective response to compliance issues.

Next Steps

- First Draft Business Licence Bylaw (now to December 2020)
- Public viewing (January to March 2021)
- Propose a new Business Licence
 Bylaw to UPC (April to July 2021)
- Prepare for implementation (now to September 2021)
- Implement the new bylaw (September 1, 2021)
