Charter Requirements

Climate Change Mitigation Plan is to be established and adopted by a resolution of Council on or before December 31, 2020.

Administration is unable to meet this December 31, 2020 deadline.

Recommendation:

That the Mayor, on behalf of City Council, write a letter to the Minister of Municipal Affairs requesting an extension of the December 31, 2020 deadline for the City to establish the Climate Change Mitigation Plan.



Looking Ahead

Continue to develop and refine the strategy and action plan.

 Identify opportunities to support provincial Natural Gas Vision and Strategy

Administration will return to Council with a full strategy and action plan in 2021 for adoption by resolution of Council, as per City Charter requirements.

 Administration will return later this month with the City's adaptation plan for adoption.

Together, we continue to help build an Edmonton that is healthier and safer, cleaner and more competitive, and fairer and more inclusive for future generations.
