### **Public Health Recommendations**

- Masks help prevent respiratory droplets from contaminating others
- Face coverings are an effective means of preventing the transmission of COVID-19 by symptomatic and asymptomatic carriers
- Wear a non-medical mask or face covering when spending time indoors with people from outside of your immediate household.

- Temporary bylaw proposed extension to May 31, 2021
- Continued education and awareness campaign
- Seeking voluntary compliance 97% compliance to date

- Warnings and enforcement, if required
- \$100 fine
