What We Heard - Community Feedback

- More women employed as Transit Operators
- Develop a text message service to discreetly report safety concerns on transit
- Ensure background checks for drivers
- Vehicle for Hire choose your driver, see suggested route, leave online reviews
- On demand transit from a GBA+ lens





Results

- Completed safety shield installation on buses
- Improved customer service & surveillance
 - More personnel to support passengers & staff
- New reporting tools & more enhancements coming
- 302% increase in reporting
 - o More awareness & opportunities to intervene
- 32% decrease in criminal occurrences
- 54% decrease in mischief maintained





COVID-19 Impacts

- Mandatory face covering policy for transit
- Regular service schedules more capacity
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Enhanced disinfecting of vehicles & facilities
- Aligned to provincial transit guidelines
- No reports of COVID transmission on transit
- Transit is a safe travel mode
