

# Temporary Pandemic Accomodation Update

- Decrease in COVID cases and close contacts over the holiday period
- Shelter capacity between 70 - 150 beds available per night
- Edmonton Isolation Facility occupancy 35 - 50%
- Planning with partner organizations for 2021

Phase of Immunization	Key Populations
<b>Early Phase 1: December 2020</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Health-care workers in intensive care units</li><li>● Respiratory therapists</li><li>● Staff in long term care and designated supportive living facilities</li></ul>
<b>Phase 1A: January 2021</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Respiratory therapists</li><li>● Health-care workers in intensive care units</li><li>● Staff in long term care and designated supportive living facilities</li><li>● Home care workers</li><li>● Health-care workers in emergency departments</li><li>● All residents of long term care and designated supportive living, regardless of age</li></ul>

# Alberta Vaccine Distribution - continued

Phase of Immunization	Key Populations
<b>Phase 1B:</b> <b>February 2021</b> <i>Timeline subject to change depending on vaccine supply</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Seniors 75 years of age and over, no matter where they live</li><li>● First Nations, Métis and persons 65 years of age and over living in a First Nations community or Metis Settlement</li><li>● Healthcare workers in medical, surgical and COVID-19 units or operating rooms</li></ul>
<b>Phase 2:</b> <b>April to September 2021</b>	Continue targeting populations at risk <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Work to identify sequencing for Phase 2 groups is underway.</li></ul>
<b>Phase 3:</b> <b>Fall 2021</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Anticipated start of roll-out to the general public</li></ul>
