Temporary Pandemic Accommodation Update

- Shelter capacity between 70 - 150 beds available per night
- Edmonton Isolation Facility occupancy 35 - 50%

Early Phase 1: December 2020	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Health-care workers in intensive care units● Respiratory therapists● Staff in long term care and designated supportive living facilities
Phase 1A: January 2021	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Respiratory therapists● Health-care workers in intensive care units● Staff in long term care and designated supportive living facilities● Home care workers● Health-care workers in emergency departments● All residents of long term care and designated supportive living, regardless of age

Alberta Vaccine Distribution - continued

Phase of Immunization	Key Populations
Phase 1B: February 2021 <i>Timeline subject to change depending on vaccine supply</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Seniors 75 years of age and over, no matter where they live• First Nations, Métis and persons 65 years of age and over living in a First Nations community or Metis Settlement• Healthcare workers in medical, surgical and COVID-19 units or operating rooms
Phase 2: April to September 2021	Continue targeting populations at risk <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Work to identify sequencing for Phase 2 groups is underway.
Phase 3: Fall 2021	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Anticipated start of roll-out to the general public
