## **Infill Construction Concerns and Enforcement Rules**

The Infill Compliance Team (the Team) is authorized to enforce infill-related infractions under a number of different municipal bylaws and provincial acts. Where concerns arise outside of the Team's authority, referrals are made to the appropriate enforcement group. The table below lists some of the common infill-related construction concerns, categorized by bylaw/legislation and responding officer type. For a full understanding of the rules and regulations pertinent to infill construction, please refer directly to each bylaw or act in their entirety.
