#### Background

- The current Business Licence Bylaw was introduced in 2002
- The business environment has changed
- A new bylaw will:
  - Remove barriers for business owners
  - Be adaptable to new or emerging businesses
  - Better align with regulatory partners



#### Developing Recommendations for a New Bylaw

#### Administration's recommendations are based on:

- Best practice research
- Consultation with internal stakeholders
- Engagement with businesses, business associations, and business improvement areas



- 1. Licence Application
  - Improve the clarity of basic application requirements
  - Enhance connections and compliance with other regulatory agencies



- 2. Licence Classifications and Fees
  - Simplify the process of categorizing business licences
  - Introduce a clear and predictable fee schedule



- 3. Licence Renewal
  - Clarify when and how licences may be renewed
  - Expedite process for certain types of businesses
  - Create an incentive for on-time renewal



- 4. Licence Review
  - Expand on the City Manager's authority to suspend, cancel, refuse, or impose conditions on a licence



Recommendations for a new Business Licence Bylaw framework and fee structure include changes in six key areas:

#### 5. Enforcement

- Clarify offences and penalties
- Address gaps in enforcement of unlicensed businesses
- Establish effective penalties for violations



- 6. Other recommendations
  - Improve the overall clarity and transparency of the bylaw



## Next Steps

- Identify implementation requirements
- Propose licence fees
- Prepare recommendations for licensing specific businesses and industries
- Update the Urban Planning Committee in May 2020
- Draft a bylaw for adoption in January 2021
