



COMMUNITY SAFETY & WELL-BEING TASK FORCE



EPS saves an average of 36 minutes per event when calls are diverted to 24/7 CD.



#2 Expand crisis diversion and alternative policing teams.

Modernize the way people respond. Shift from enforcer to helper.

#3 inclusive and diverse, anti-racist organizational structures.

Examine and pursue ways to #4 prevent unnecessary use of force by police, peace and bylaw officers.

Identify how collective agreements contribute to systemic bias and work to address those challenges.

#6 Create new regulatory college for police and peace officers.

BUILD AND SUSTAIN TRUST

Ensure the Edmonton Police Commission provides stronger guidance and oversight to police.

Change composition and recruitment of Edmonton Police Commission to reflect community.

#9

Establish mechanisms to provide community direction to peace and bylaw officers employed by City of Edmonton.

#10

Bring transparency and independence to public complaint processes.



#12

Enact policies and standards that place focus on proactively and effectively providing support to disadvantaged Edmontonians.




#13 Invest in urgent priorities for community safety.

Bring police funding into line with comparable cities and tie a portion of funding to specific performance.
