Most Common Vehicle for Hire Bylaw Violations

- Driving Transportation Network Vehicle without dispatcher marking (36 fines)
- Failure to produce mechanical inspection certificate (27 fines)
- Permit passengers to disembark while stopped illegally (17 fines)

Expenses

Administrative (including personnel)	\$607,881
Shared costs (branch & front counter)	\$213,112
Community Standards	\$657,624

2021 Vehicle for Hire Work Plan

The 2021 priorities include:

- → Stakeholder engagement
- → Accessible service strategies
- → Safety measures in vehicles for hire
- → Bylaw review for potential amendment
- → Education
- → Monitoring and data gathering
- → Enforcement strategy review

That 2021 fees within Vehicle for Hire Bylaw 17400, for dispatch and vehicle licences, be waived by 50 percent.
