

Strategies to Increase Visitable Housing Form

Motion to be Rescinded

Recommendation

That the following motion passed at the April 5, 2017, Urban Planning Committee meeting, be rescinded:

That Administration provide a report on the visitable housing pilot project in First Quarter 2019.

Clerk's Note:

In accordance with Council Procedures Bylaw 18155, a motion to rescind a motion that has been passed may be offered subsequent to the meeting at which the motion was passed if the rescinding is:

- (a) made by a Councillor who voted with the prevailing side;
- (b) brought more than one year after the date of the original motion; or
- (c) brought after a General Election which has taken place since the date of the original motion.

Since a General Election has taken place since the date the original motion was passed, any Councillor may move that the motion be rescinded.
