

Bylaw 19644

General Repealing Bylaw 2021

Recommendation

1. That Bylaw 19644 be given the appropriate readings.
2. That the City Policies listed in Attachment 2 of the April 19, 2021, Office of the City Manager report CR_8139, be repealed.
3. That the motions listed in Attachment 3 of the April 19, 2021, Office of the City Manager report CR_8139, be rescinded.
4. That revised Civic Protocol Policy C419B, as set out in Attachment 4 of the April 19, 2021, Office of the City Manager report CR_8139, be approved.

Purpose

To repeal bylaws that have expired or are otherwise no longer required, and amend clerical errors.

Readings

Bylaw 19644 is ready for three readings.

A majority vote of City Council on all three readings is required for passage.

If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, then prior to moving third reading, Council must unanimously agree “That Bylaw 19644 be considered for third reading.”

Position of Administration

Administration supports this Bylaw.

Report Summary

This is a general repealing report to rescind or repeal bylaws, policies and motions that have expired, been replaced or are otherwise no longer required, and to address clerical errors.

Report

This report provides for the repeal of bylaws and policies that are no longer required, the rescission of expired or redundant motions, and the correction of non-substantive errors in bylaws and policies. The Office of the City Clerk coordinates this review with City departments and will continue to bring similar reports to Council on a regular basis. Additionally, Administration continues to work through a list of potentially outdated bylaws, and will include any appropriate for repeal in future General Repealing Bylaw reports.

Administration has identified seven bylaws that can be repealed as they are no longer in use, and three bylaws that need to be amended to correct clerical errors. The Bylaws to be repealed are:

- Bylaw 14843 - 2008 Business Improvement Area Tax and Tax Rate Bylaw
- Bylaw 14992 - Landlord and Tenant Advisory Board Bylaw
- Bylaw 16014 - A Bylaw to authorize the City of Edmonton to impose a special tax for the repair and maintenance of the Alley Lighting
- Bylaw 7497 - A Bylaw to authorize an agreement with the Province of Alberta for lease of land at the Edmonton Municipal Airport
- Bylaw 7907 - Bylaw to authorize a Memorandum of Understanding and a land lease with the Government of Canada for the provisions of aviation services required to operate the Edmonton Municipal Airport
- Bylaw 7970 - Bylaw to authorize an agreement with the Province of Alberta for lease of hangar space at the Edmonton Municipal Airport
- Bylaw 9583 - A Bylaw to approve an Agreement with Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada Regarding the Canada Customs Services Cost Recovery Agreement at the Edmonton Municipal Airport

All of the above bylaws are attached for reference.

Bylaw 13655 - EPCOR Distribution & Transmission Inc. Franchise Agreement Bylaw is amended to correct a typographical error in Section 2.

Bylaw 14614 - Public Places Bylaw is amended to add an additional marginal note for clarity and to aid in locating the newly added wildlife feeding provisions.

Bylaw 15309 - Fire Rescue Services Bylaw is amended to reflect proper phrasing in Section 2(g).

The policies and motions for repeal and rescission, including justifications for the proposed actions, are listed in Attachments 2 and 3. Policies are available online at edmonton.ca.

Administration recommends approval of revised Civic Protocol Policy C419B. The Policy and Procedures were both approved by City Council on October 24, 2011. However, the Procedures are within Administration’s delegated authority, and should not have been approved as part of the Policy. There is no content change to the revised Policy, but the Procedures have been removed so that they can be edited by Administration.
