


Climate Change Impacts



- Increased risk of urban flooding, more frequent and intense weather events, changing ecosystems
- Edmonton's GDP could be reduced by \$3.2 billion annually on average by the 2050s
- An additional 22,000 health incidents a year are expected to occur by the 2050s



Opportunities for Edmonton

- Create more economic opportunities for Edmontonians while maintaining a low carbon economy
- Capitalize and diversify the economy through new investments within emerging industries in the energy and innovation sectors
- Respond to changing global markets, while creating prosperity, economic diversity, and supporting Edmontonians in a just and equitable way





Energy Transition - Progress Underway







- Extension of LRT network; 40 electric buses; Protected bike lanes in downtown core, Curbside electric charging stations; EV charging rebates
- Residential solar rebates; Downtown district energy system; Waste to bio-fuel; Solar on 5 City facilities with 12 more planned in 2021
- Blatchford development; Rebates for energy efficiency; Building labelling and benchmarking; City facilities constructed to LEED Silver standard



Planning, Policy & Regulation

- C627 Climate Resilience Policy
- Bylaw for Clean Energy Improvement Program



Process & Service Delivery

- Integrate actions into existing business plans
- Integrated carbon accounting framework
- \$100 Million/annually in future budget services packages



Data & Measurement

- Annual reporting (as per Charter requirement)
- Monitoring transition thresholds and signals
