Executive Summary

The report provides an overview of the Edmonton Combative Sports Commission activities for 2019 and 2020, and the Commission's 2021 Work Plan, in accordance with City Policy C575C, Agencies, Boards, Committees and Commissions.

Report

Under Bylaw 15638, Edmonton Combative Sports Commission Bylaw, the Commission is established to control and regulate all aspects of professional combative sports, with the exception of sports entertainment wrestling, and all professional combative sport events in the City. The Commission is comprised of seven volunteer members and is supported by an Executive Director, hired by City Administration, and responsible for all operational functions related to combative sports events (e.g. licensing and permitting decisions).

In accordance with City Policy C575C, Agencies, Boards, Committees and Commissions, the Edmonton Combative Sports Commission annually reports to City Council on its activities. The Commission's annual reports for 2019 and 2020 can be found in Attachment 1 and the 2021 Work Plan is provided in Attachment 2.
