Integrated Pest Management Policy

Purpose:

To provide a decision-making framework for integrated pest management to protect public health and safety, to preserve ecological sustainability, to promote livability, and to comply with legislative obligations with respect to regulated pests and invasive species.

Alternative Weed Control

- Enhanced plant health care
- Mulching
- Alternative chemical control methods (e.g. horticultural vinegar, compost tea)
- Insects for biocontrol
- Piloting goats for weed control in naturalized areas
- High temperature steam for weed control in sidewalk cracks
- Volunteer programs including Partners in Parks and weed pull events
